Count Charge

Complainant, Lyn Blankenship
personally appearing before me and being duly sworn, states that on or about the 23rd day of March, 2008, at or near Sitka, in the First Judicial District, State of Alaska, Jason Alek ABBOTT, DOB: 6/1/1989, did recklessly cause physical injury to K.J. by grabbing her arm, squeezing and pushing her against wall, and by words or other conduct, did unlawfully and recklessly place K.J. in fear of imminent physical injury by attempting to punch her in the face with a closed fist.

All of which is a Class A Misdemeanor offense being contrary to and in violation of AS 11.41.230(a)(1) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alaska.

This complaint is based on the observations and written report of Officer Jason SEXTON of the Sitka Police Department, which states he responded to a domestic disturbance in progress at 105 Peter Simpson Drive. Further, Officer SEXTON made contact with the victim, K.J., who was visibly upset and crying. Further, K.J. is the mother of the defendant. Further, K.J. stated the defendant had come home at approximately 0400 hours and woke up the family because he was upset that an orange sign was in the house. Further, K.J. stated that the

defendant does not like the colors red and orange and believes them to be evil colors. Further, K.J. asked the defendant to return a set of red table place mats that were missing from the residence and the defendant stated he had thrown them away. Further, the K.J. stated that the defendant screamed at her to go to her room and then grabbed her by the arms and pushed her against the wall. Further, K.J. stated that the defendant tried to punch her with a closed fist, which grazed her chin, at which point she became afraid of him and went to her bedroom, closed the door and called the police. Further, the defendant left the scene prior to officers arriving but was later contacted by Sergeant Walter SMITH and Officer Jeff SADOWSKI. Further, the defendant admitted to having an argument with K.J. about the color red but denied that it ever got physical. Finally, the defendant was arrested for Assault in the Fourth Degree (Domestic Violence).
